
## About NADO's Mission

Strengthen local governments, communities and economies through the regional strategies, partnerships and solutions of the nation's regional development organizations

The generic term Regional Development Organizations (RDO) is used to describe a multi-jurisdictional, public-based regional planning and development organization

These public-sector entities are governed by a regional policy board with majority control by local elected officials. As mandated by various federal programs, RDO boards may also include business, nonprofit, education and community leaders

- The legal basis for most RDOs originates through state statute or gubernatorial executive order, or MOU of local governments
- RDOs may have many different federal program designations, such as:
  - **Economic Development District** for U.S. Economic Development Administration
  - Local Development District for a Federal-State Regional Commission (i.e. ARC, DRA)
  - Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and/or Rural Transportation Planning
    Organization (RPO) for Transportation Planning

National Association of Development Organizations

- Serve as forum to craft regional solutions for areawide needs and opportunities
- Prepare plans and strategies for broad range of regional and local issues, including compliance with federal mandates and requirements
- Strengthen local governments through technical assistance, public administration and leadership capacity
- Advocate for regions and locals at federal and state levels

# Overview of RDO Data Project

- Create a new national GIS database and maps of the nation's
   556 regional development organizations (RDOs)
- Organizational profiles highlight a sample of federal program designations and management responsibilities of RDOs
- The first round of data only covers select federal programs and is *NOT* intended as a final list or description of the diverse programs and operations of RDOs

# Overview of RDO Data Project

As of January 2011, NADO has collected federal program profiles for 517 of the nation's 556 regional councils / regional development organizations

• Many RDOs manage additional federal programs that were *NOT* included in the profile survey, especially community/social services, emergency management, homeland security, housing, transit and weatherization


- Note: Regional councils are defined as multi-purpose, multi-jurisdictional regional planning organizations serving local governments
- Since this definition does NOT typically encompass some single-purpose, regional planning organizations serving only as EDA Economic Development Districts, NADO uses the more generic term *Regional Development Organizations or RDOs* to include both categories



- 41 DRA Local Development Districts (LDDs) (Out of 44)


#### **EDA Economic Development Districts - EDD Funded**



#### **EDA Revolving Loan Fund Operators - EDA RLF**




#### **EDA Post-Disaster Recovery Grantee**



#### **Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)**




#### **Rural Planning Organizations (RPOs)**






#### **USDA Intermediary Relending Program (IRP)**




#### **USDA Rural Business Enterprise Grant (RBEG)**




#### **SBA 504 Certified Development Company**



#### **SBA Microenterprise Lending Program**





- 81 RDOs Operate One-Stop Center or Job Link Center



**504 CDC:** 504 Certified Development Company designated by the U.S. Small Business Administration

**AAA:** Area Agency on Agency through U.S. Department of Health and Human Services

**CDFI:** Community Development Financial Institution designated by the U.S. Treasury Department

**EDA RLF:** Revolving Loan Fund intermediary for the U.S. Economic Development Administration

**EDD:** Economic Development District designated by the U.S. Economic Development Administration

**GIS:** Geographic Information System (GIS) program used to manage and analyze layers of information

**IRP:** USDA Rural Development Intermediary Relending Program

**LDD:** Local Development District designated by a federal-state regional commission, such as the

Appalachian Regional Commission, Delta Regional Authority or Northern Border Regional Commission

MPO: Metropolitan Planning Organization for federal surface transportation planning

**RBEG:** Rural Business Enterprise Grants awarded by USDA Rural Development

**RDO:** Regional Development Organization

**RPO:** Rural Transportation Planning Organization designated by state DOT or by local governments

WIB: Workforce Investment Board recognized by the U.S. Department of Labor
