National Programs:

Research & Knowledge Sharing: Native Americans in Philanthropy will coordinate, collect, and share research which intersects Native communities and issues with the philanthropic and nonprofit sectors

Leadership Networks: NAP is committed to nurturing intentional hubs of Leadership Networks that add value to Native leadership and capacity building programs. Together these hubs will form the backbone of an local network that will be connected nationally through our ENetwork.

Native Philanthropy Institute: An annual meeting that gathers Tribal Leaders, tribal entities, Native and non-Native foundations and nonprofits engage to foster and facilitate dialogue and action to improve philanthropy at-large and engaging practitioners through a Native lens and deepened understanding.

NAP on the Ground:

Art of Reciprocity: A fund development curriculum that is a decolonized model of giving, receiving and sharing of resources in Native communities.

Native Culture and Context for Philanthropy: An education series of 4 symposia to engage philanthropic organizations working with Native communities to deepen understanding and expand cultural competence.

Circle of Leaders: 18-month leadership program engages emerging Native leaders and educates them in the field of philanthropy and nonprofits through professional development, networking, and mentorship opportunities. The empowerment of Native philanthropic leadership is an essential factor toward building healthy and sustainable communities enhanced by the Native spirit of generosity.
