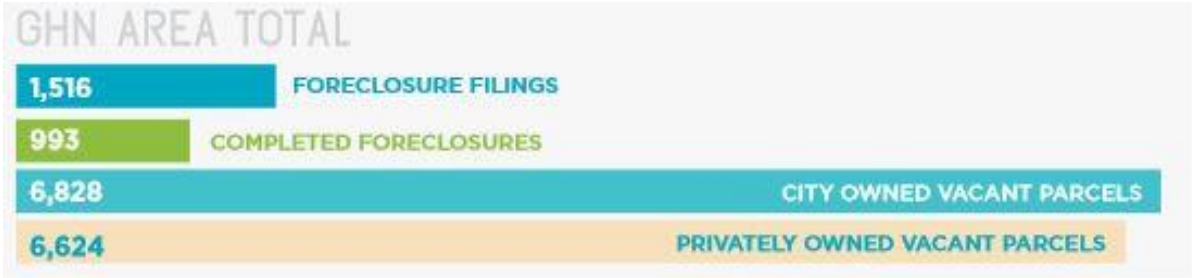

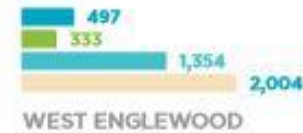
Green Healthy Neighborhoods (GHN) Land Use Plan

BY NEIGHBORHOOD

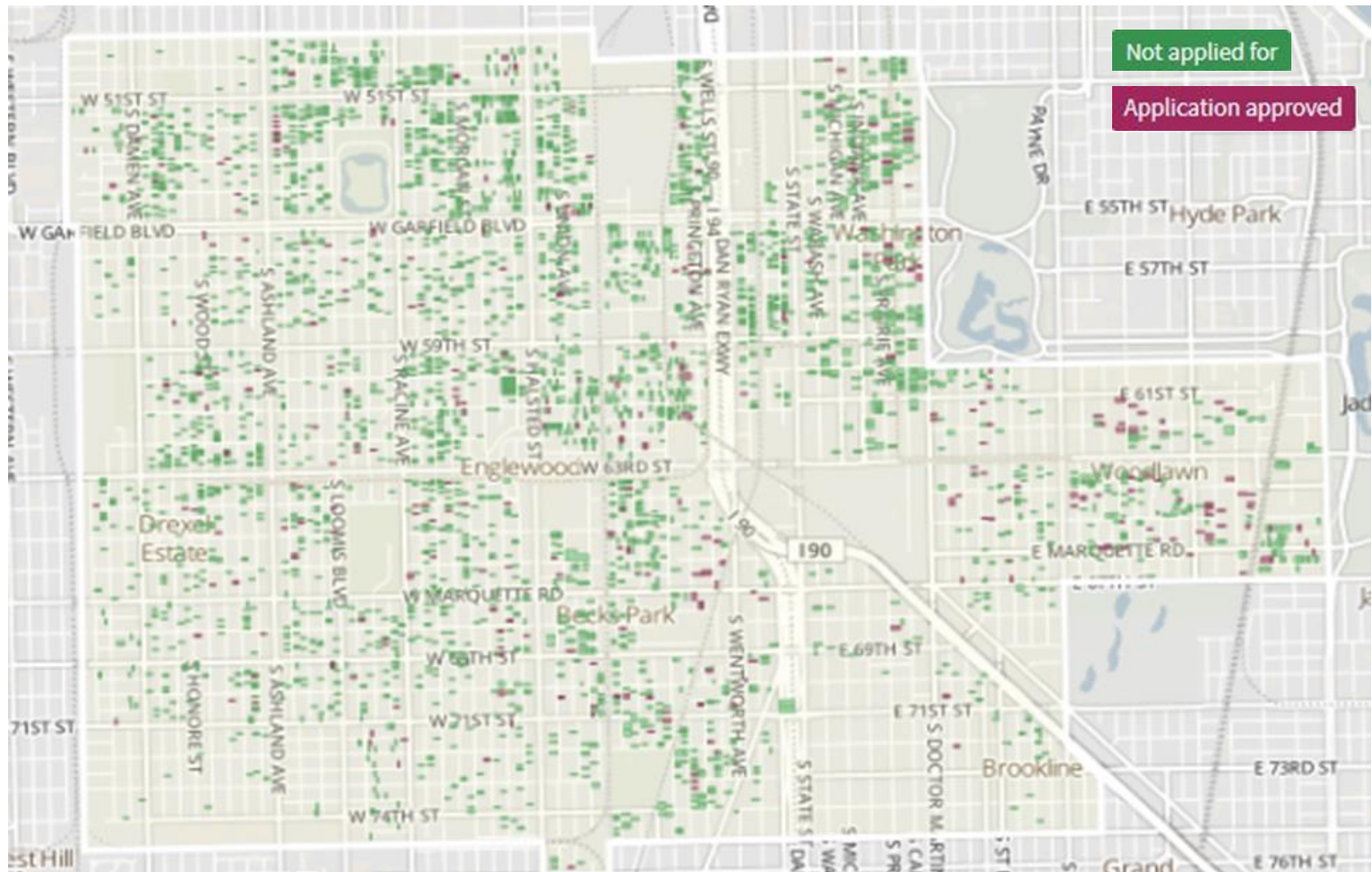

Large Lot Program Chicago Mid-south Communities

- Sell City-owned lots to property owners, including nonprofits, who own property on the block for \$1
- Provides opportunities to create wealth in the neighborhoods by allowing applicants to sell property after owning and maintaining it for a five year period
- **322 lots up for transfer approval in 2014 (est. \$143,000/year in property tax for unimproved lots)**

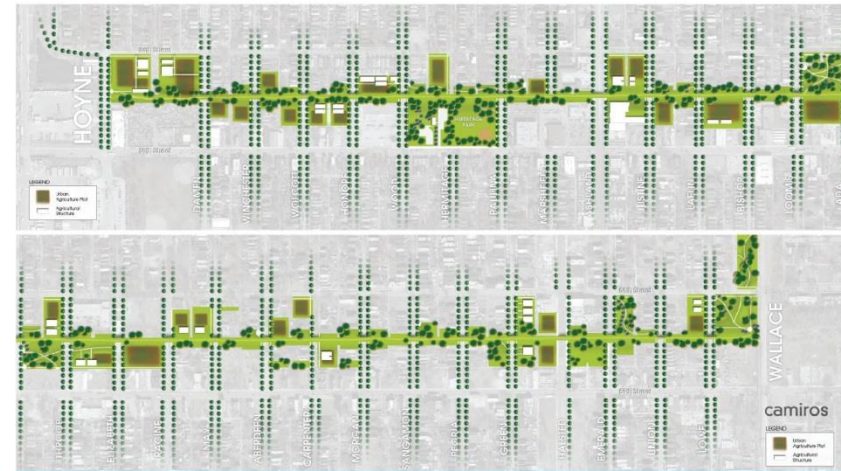

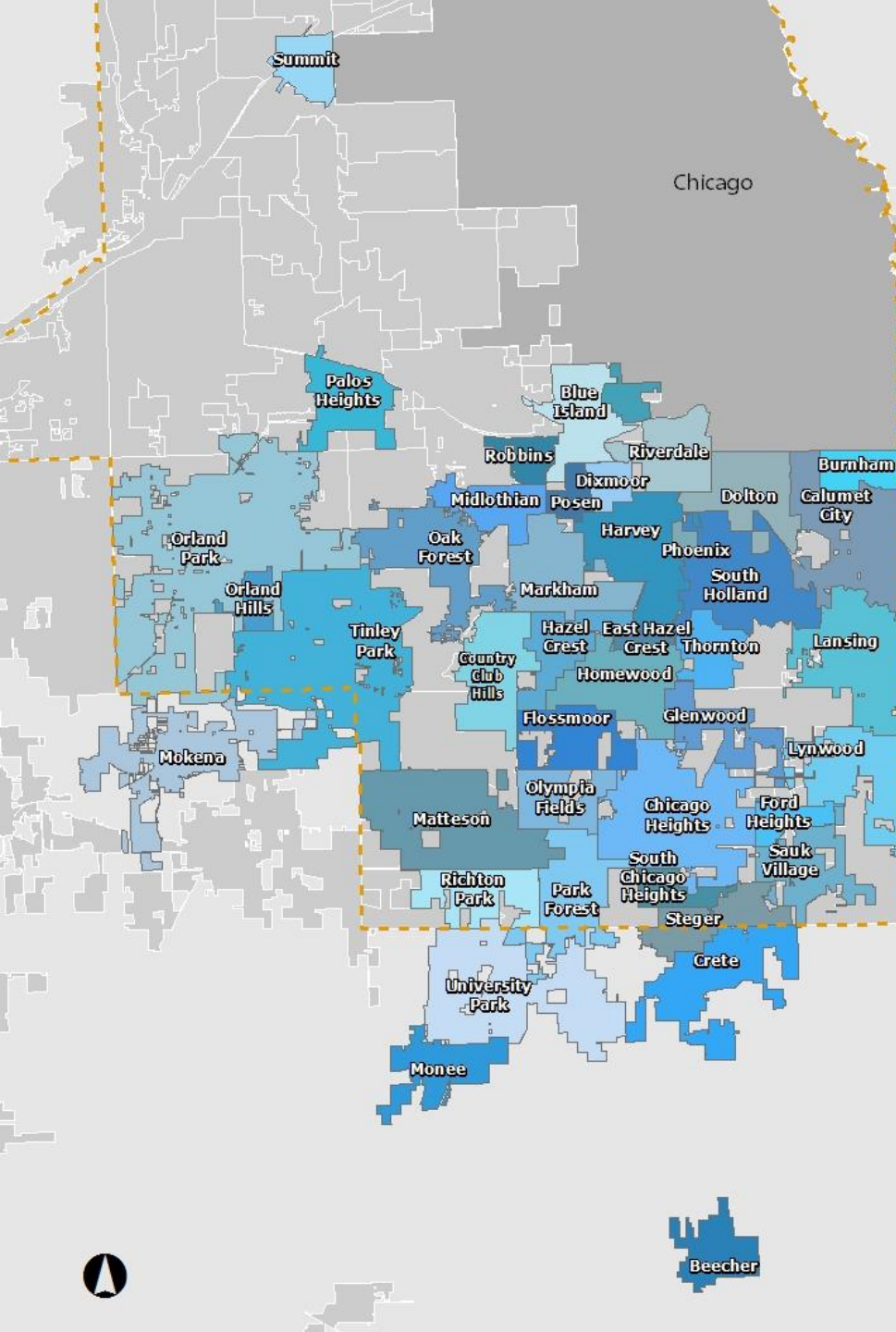

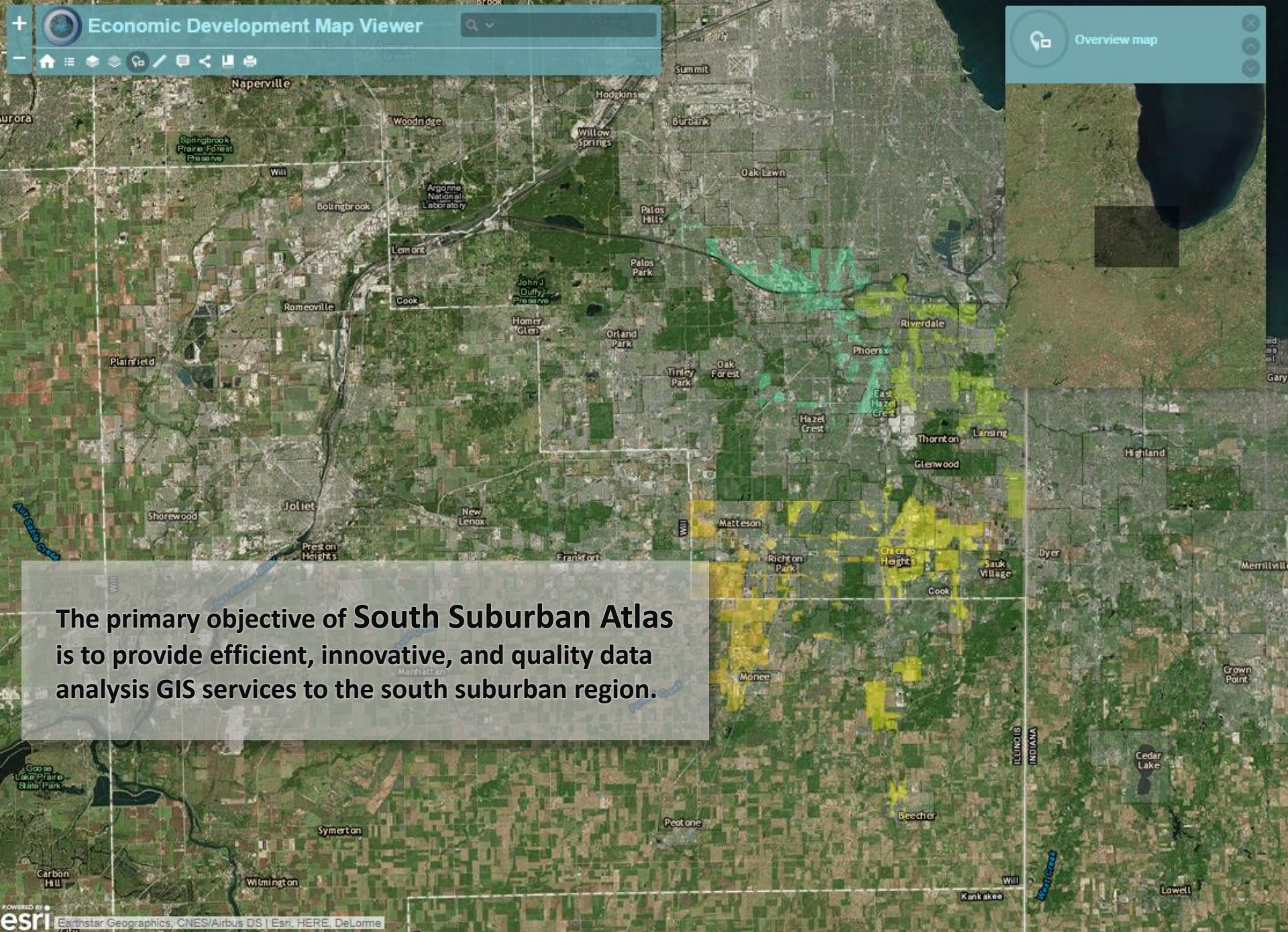


Chicago Southland's Green TIME Zone:

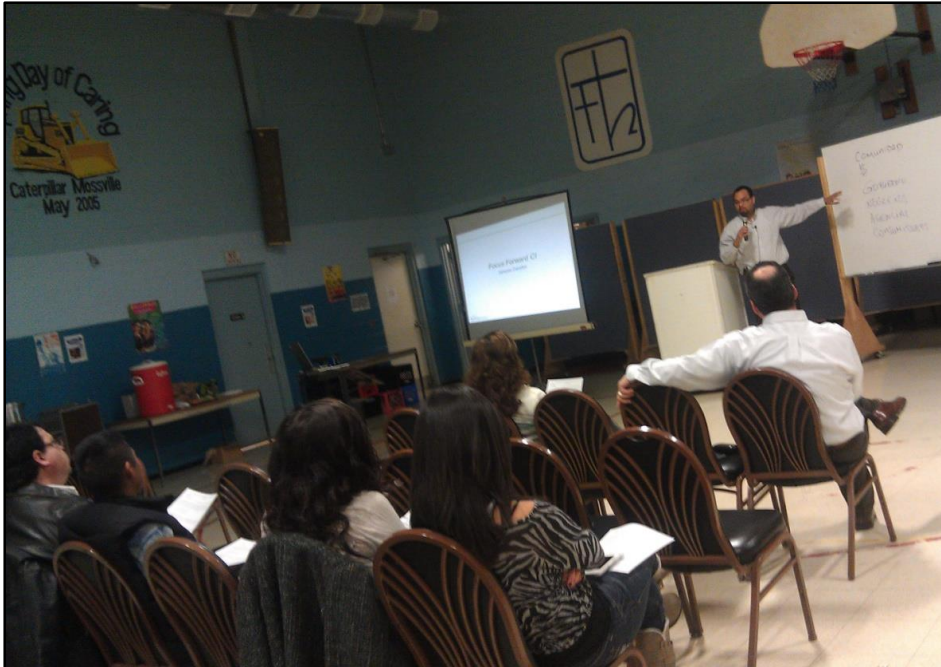
