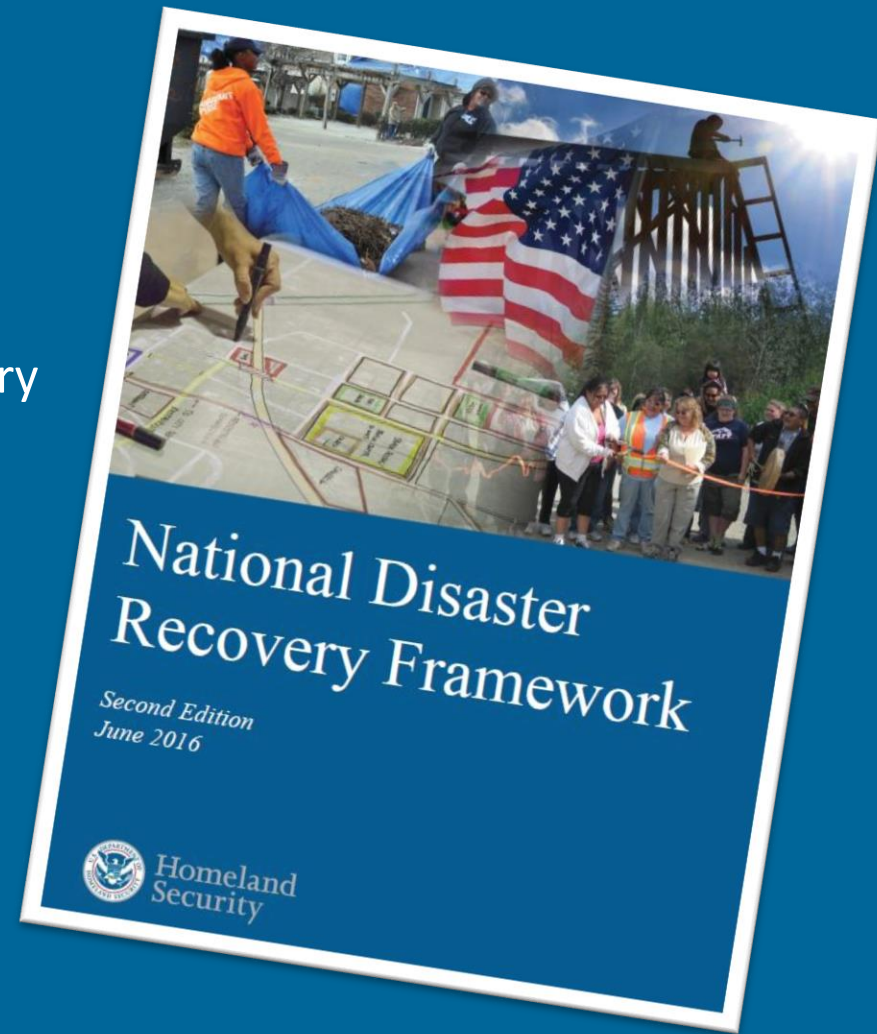

National Disaster Recovery Framework

- Elevates focus on recovery
- Sets national policy and doctrine
- Recommended recovery roles:
 - Federal, State, Local, Business, Non-Profit, Public
- Defines Leadership
 - Federal Disaster Recovery Coordinator, State Disaster Recovery Coordinator, Local Disaster Recovery Manager
- Coordination Structure
 - Six Recovery Support Functions
- Planning
 - Pre and Post Disaster Planning
- Resilience and Mitigation

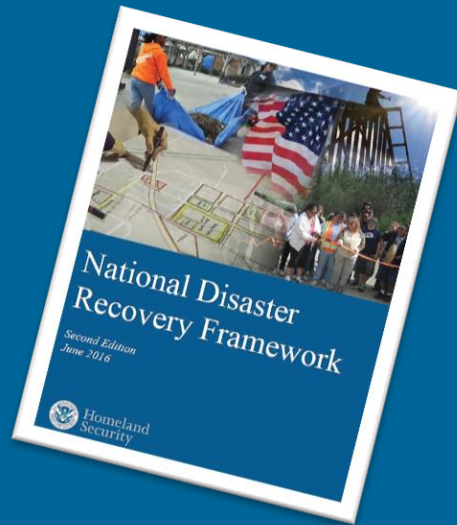

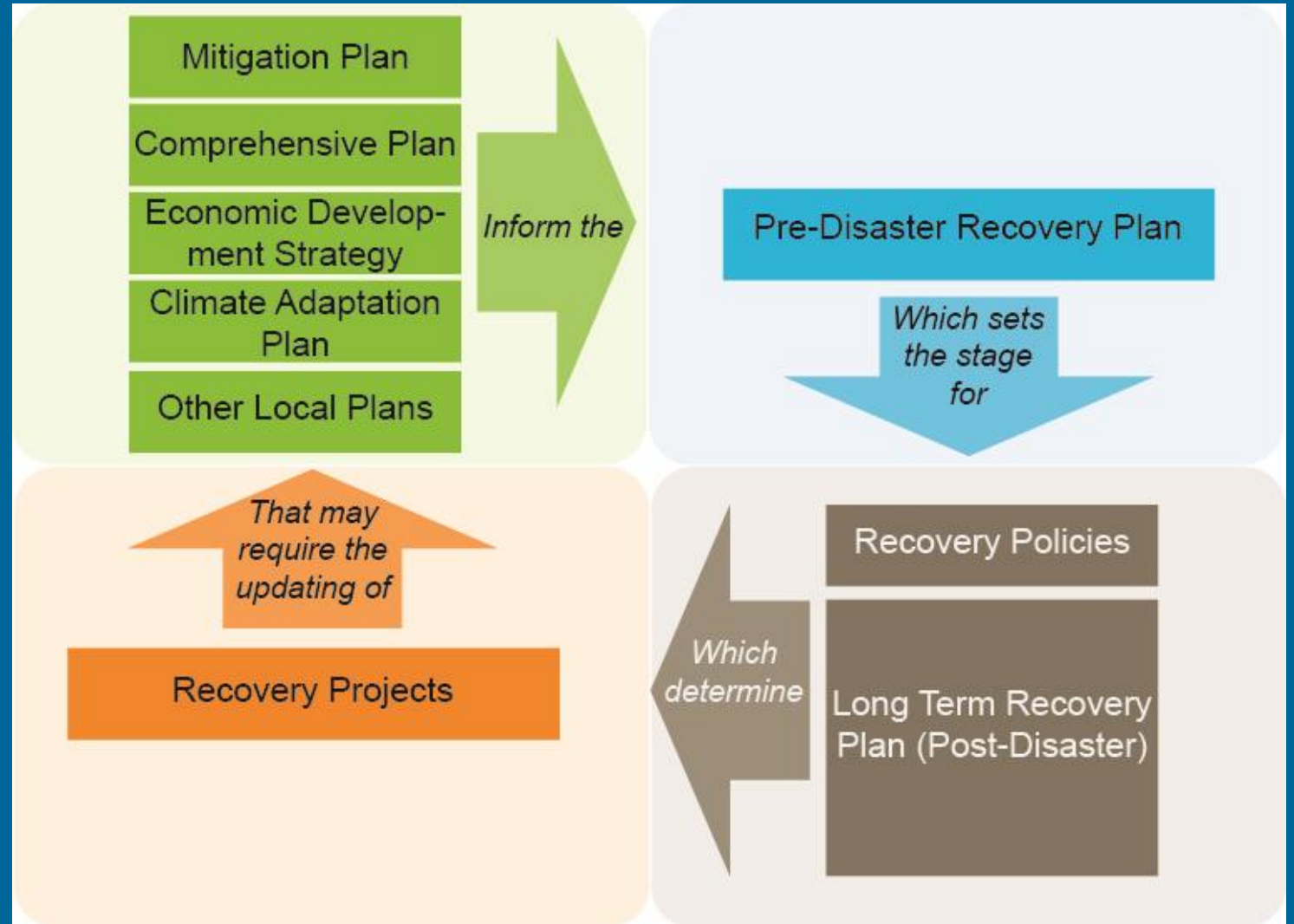
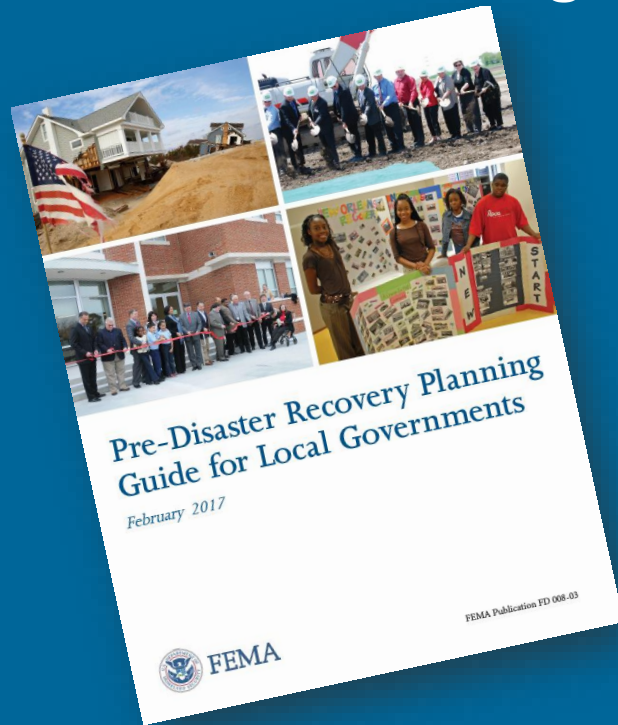
Expanding Disaster Management

- Emergency Managers cannot possibly handle all disaster management
- Long-term resilience requires urban planners, health professionals, economic and international developers, social services professionals, etc to take responsibility for mitigating risks, reshaping disaster recovery



Planning

- Pre-Disaster Planning
- Post-Disaster Planning

Post Disaster Recovery Planning

- **Regional or Community-Level Long-Term Recovery Plans** – Rapid adaptation. Development of community goals, objectives, policies, priorities and major reconstruction projects. Key is leadership and community participation.
- **Site, Facility or System Specific Plans** - such as downtown redevelopment plan, school district recovery plan, or urban redesign plan
- **Updates to Pre-Existing Comprehensive, Land Use, Economic Development and Hazard Mitigation Plans**
- **Policies and Requirements that Drive Investments** – Executive Order 13690 Federal Flood Risk Management Standard

Community Planning and Capacity Building RSF

- Support states, tribes, territories and local governments
- Enable local level post-disaster planning for recovery
- Build local capacity to manage recovery
- Organize technical assistance, funding, education, data, guidance
- Integrate resilience, sustainability and risk considerations into recovery plans
- Encourage community engagement in the recovery process
