



DELTA REGIONAL AUTHORITY

SUPPORT FUNDING IN THE FY2019 APPROPRIATIONS PROCESS

ACTION NEEDED: Urge your members of Congress, especially those serving on the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, to support funding for the Delta Regional Authority’s (DRA) community and economic development programs for fiscal year (FY) 2019 at no less than the FY2018-approved level of \$25 million. DRA resources are used for basic infrastructure improvements, job creation initiatives, leadership development, and other essential community and economic development investments in one of the most distressed regions of the nation.

BACKGROUND: The Delta Regional Authority is a regional economic development agency that represents a partnership between federal, state, and local government. Established in 2000, DRA works to improve life for the 10 million people who reside in the 252 Delta counties and parishes in eight states (Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, and Tennessee). DRA is governed by the governors of the eight Delta states and a federal co-chair, who is appointed by the president and confirmed by the U.S. Senate. Local participation is provided through multi-county local development districts.

The 252 counties and parishes served by the Delta Regional Authority make up one of the most distressed areas of the country. The disparities between the Delta region and the nation are stark. As defined by the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA), many of the counties and parishes in the region are distressed. The Delta region encompasses 111 of the 386 counties listed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) as suffering from “persistent poverty.”

LATEST ACTION: Both House and Senate Appropriations committees have approved FY2019 funding for DRA. The agency is funded through the Energy and Water spending bill; the House passed its version of the bill on June 7 however the Senate has yet to take up the measure. Spending will need to be approved before the fiscal year begins on October 1.

On March 23, the president signed a \$1.2 trillion omnibus spending bill for FY2018 which funds federal operations through September 30, 2018. Before the bill’s approval, the federal government had been operating under a series of continuing resolutions since the beginning of the current fiscal year.

On February 12, the Trump administration released its FY2019 budget proposal, “Efficient, Effective, Accountable: An American Budget.” The budget requests \$465 billion for non-defense discretionary spending and \$627 for defense discretionary spending. The proposal includes elimination of DRA and requests \$2.5 million for costs associated with orderly closure of the agency.

The following table details final funding from FY2017 and FY2018 as well as the president’s FY2019 budget request and House and Senate Appropriations Committee-approved FY2019 figures:

KEY TALKING POINTS

- Since its creation, the Delta Regional Authority has worked to improve the lives of the 10 million people who live in the Delta. Targeted investments in each of the eight states have helped to **create and retain 55,140 jobs**.
- From FY2002 through FY2017, DRA has invested over \$185 million into 1,149 projects in the Delta region leveraging more than \$1 billion in other public funds and attracting nearly \$2.5 billion in private-sector funds. Overall, DRA investments have helped to generate **\$3 billion in public and private investments, an overall leverage ratio of 18.9 to 1**.
