# John Fleming Confirmed as Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Development

On March 7, 2019 the Senate voted 67-30 to confirm John Fleming as the Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Development. In this role, Fleming will oversee the US Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA). Fleming previously served as a Congressman representing Louisiana's fourth district from 2009 to 2017.

# March 17, 2019 Deadline Approaching: Apply for an Excellence in Regional Transportation Award

NADO members and their partners have until **March 17, 2019** to submit applications for NADO and RPO America's Excellence in Regional Transportation Award. This program recognizes noteworthy projects and practices in rural and small metropolitan areas that help meet regional needs through various program areas, including: bicycle and pedestrian planning, air quality, equity, ITS, project implementation, public involvement, safety, transit, freight, regional transportation planning, and other project types or issue areas. # **USDA** Accepting Applications for Communities Connect Program Grants Increasing Access to Broadband in Rural Areas

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development is accepting applications for grants to establish broadband infrastructure in unserved rural communities. The Community Connect Program helps rural communities extend access where broadband service is least likely to be commercially available, but where it can make a tremendous difference in the quality of life for people and businesses. State and local governments, federally-recognized tribes, nonprofits, and for-profit corporations are eligible to apply. Grants awarded through this program must be used to provide broadband service at a minimum rate-of-data transmission of 25 megabits downstream and 3 megabits upstream, which is the speed benchmark for broadband connectivity adopted by the Federal Communications Commission. Awardees must also use their USDA funding to offer free broadband service to all critical community facilities and a community center in their proposed service area for two years.

The minimum grant amount is \$100,000; the maximum amount is \$3 million. Applicants must be able to provide a 15 percent match on the desired grant amount. The deadline to apply is **April 15, 2019**. For additional information about the current application window, see the <u>Funding Opportunity Announcement</u>. # USDA is Seeking Applications for Technology Grants to Expand Access to Healthcare and Education in Rural Areas

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development is accepting applications for grants to use broadband technology to improve access to healthcare and educational services in rural communities. Rural Development will award grants ranging from \$50,000 to \$500,000 through its <u>Distance Learning and Telemedicine (DLT) Grant Program</u>. The grants can be used to finance telecommunication equipment, computer networks, and advanced technologies to support job training, academic instruction, or access to specialized medical care in rural areas.

The application deadline is **May 15, 2019**. Grants are awarded through a national competition. Each application must provide evidence of consultation with the Rural Development State Director. When requesting evidence of consultation, applicants should provide an executive summary of the project, as well as the proposed grant and match amounts. Prior to applying, applicants are encouraged to review the <u>2019 Traditional Application Guide</u>. #### **Application Cycle for the 2019 POWER Initiative Now Open**

The Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) is now accepting applications for the 2019 round of the Partnership for Opportunity and Workforce and Economic Revitalization (POWER) initiative. The 2019 Request for Proposals (RFP) is available <a href="here">here</a>. Completed applications are due no later than **April 10, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. ET.** Approximately \$45 million will be awarded through this competitive grant process.

In FY 2019, ARC's POWER Initiative will continue to focus on regional investments that maximize economic revitalization in the Appalachian region's coal-impacted communities. Before submitting a funding proposal, potential applicants must contact the appropriate ARC <u>state program manager</u> for specific guidance pertaining to the eligible use of POWER funds in their state.

ARC has awarded \$120 million to date through the POWER Initiative in order to help coalimpacted communities in 309 Appalachian counties diversify and grow their economies. The Economic Development Administration (EDA) is now accepting applications for the <u>2019</u> Regional Innovation Strategies (RIS) Program. The <u>RIS Program</u> offers funding through two competitions:

- **FY19 i6 Challenge**—catalyzing high-growth entrepreneurship throughout the country, the i6 Challenge awards up to \$750,000 for projects that increase regional capacity to accelerate the translation of innovations, ideas, intellectual property, and research into products, services, companies, and jobs.
- **FY19 Seed Fund Support (SFS) Grant Competition**—unlocking risk capital for entrepreneurs and startups to grow, SFS grants provide up to \$300,000 for projects that create, launch, or expand equity-based seed funds or that create networks and tools that enable capital to flow into high-growth startups in all parts of the country.

The city of Waterbury, Connecticut is seeking a City Planner. The City Planner performs professional and administrative work. This position directs, actively manages, and leads the Planning Department which oversees: land use, wetlands, and zoning enforcement. The City Planner is responsible for short and long-term planning needs of the city, including the City Plan of Conservation and Development which was last updated in 2015 and will require updating by 2025.
