- Other changes: updated language on broadband and environmental sustainability; removed section on Opportunity Zones








Growth/Expansion of EDDs

Applications for EDD designation have swelled since 2020

- Over 400 designated/active EDDs
- More than 85% of counties covered by an EDD
- 6 cross-state EDDs

EDDs are critical to EDA. . . and vital to regional economic development capacity building





CEDS Help Build Regional Capacity

- Volume and complexity of federal support for economic development can be difficult to navigate.
 - New funding and programs from an array of agencies
 - Eligibility, timing, procedures vary
 - Capacity required to assess, compete, implement
- **EDDs** are essential convenors, curators, connectors, networkers, facilitators and implementors for advancing regional and statewide CEDS.
- CEDS process is a crucial forum for scanning, prioritizing and coordinating a strategic, regional approach for the integrated use of myriad local, state and federal funds.

- Developed in partnership with New Growth Innovation Network (NGIN), building on their Inclusive Recovery Guide
 - ✓ Includes over 100 inclusive recovery ideas drawn from more than 35 EDDs

Climate Resilience

- Part of the broader focus on resilience
- Fits well with the asset-focused, regional nature of the CEDS
- Involves assessing how climate change will create new or increased risks . . .and taking steps to better cope with these risks (mitigation and adaptation)
- Includes mitigation strategies and adaptation techniques
- Recommended approach:
 - 1) assess risks and vulnerabilities (for businesses, facilities, workers, & community as a whole)
 - 2) prioritize identified actions
 - 3) investigate options to implement

Our Vision for the Region


