

#### **Downtown Revitalization Efforts Timeline (2015-16)**





With funding from the Gallup BID and New Mexico Finance Authority, Gallup was the first community to develop these plans in a tandem planning and public engagement process. While they are stand-alone plans, the priority projects lists in each are mutually inclusive. These plans both reflect the Coal Avenue Event Street, which received the second highest votes from the community, next to a new Downtown library.







#### CHALK THE WALK

During the June ArtsCrawl assisted by local artists, community members were asked to chalk their design dreams for Coal Avenue.















#### HANDS-ON COMMUNITY WORKSHOP

This community workshop involved dividing into two groups to develop artistic concepts for Coal Avenue.











#### PARKLET COMPETITION

Through a competitive selection process, two groups were chosen to design, build, and install parklets during the July ArtsCrawl. A parklet is a sidewalk extension that provides more space and amenities for people using the street. Usually parklets are installed on parking lanes and use several parking spaces. ... Parklets offer a place to stop, to sit, and to rest while taking in the activities of the street.

Artists, local organizations, student groups, and community teams are invited to submit proposals for a temporary Coal Avenue Parklet to be installed during ArtsCrawl: Up in the Air on July 14th.

#### THE PROCESS

- Submit a proposal by e-mail to artscrawl@galluparts.org or in-person to ART123 Gallery, including:
  - a. The name of your team, and names of the team members, and contact information.
  - b. The title and theme of your proposed Parklet.
  - c. A sketch/image of your proposed Parklet.
  - d. A budget proposal for a \$300 materials budget (provided) to construct the Parklet.
- 2. Proposals are due by Friday, June 1, 2018
- 3. Selected teams will be notified by Friday, June 8, 2018 and will be responsible for preparing, constructing, installing, and de-installing their Parklet by/on July 14th.

#### FINAL COMMUNITY WORKSHOP



#### PLAZA STREET OPTION




















